3 Entries

3.1 Opening and Closing Dates

The above are the dates and times by which payment must be **received**. The postmark of any correspondence will not be considered when determining whether an entry is received early. We remind competitors that instant credit card payment is available through the web site.

3.2 Entry Procedure

The entry application will only be accepted through the official online entry form and accompanied by the total entry fee. Your entry will only be secured with payment in full.

The entry application will only be accepted online and accompanied by the total entry fee. Reserved Entry is available to those who entered either last year's event or the most recent event in the Atlantic Rally Cup or Atlantic RallyMoto™ Cup at the time Reserved Entry opens. Reserved Entry eligibility may also be purchased for \$200 which does not count toward the entry fee.

The Reserved Entry fee will only be available to those competitors who have paid before the Reserved Entry period ends. The Early Entry fee will only be available to those competitors who have paid before the Regular Entry period begins. The Regular Entry fee will only be available to those competitors who have paid before the Late Entry period begins. Submitting your online Entry Form early without payment will not suffice.

3.3 Event Cancellation

The organizers reserve the right to cancel the event if insufficient entries are received before the Early Entry Deadline.

3.4 Number of Entrants Accepted

Initially, 30 entries will be reserved for cars and 40 entries will be reserved for motorcycles. When Regular entry begins, these reserves vanish. A total of 50 minutes worth vehicles will be accepted, with each motorcycle counting as 30 seconds.

3.5 Eligible Classes

For the Atlantic Rally Cup, AWD and 2WD will be scored.

The following car classes will be scored although they do not count toward a championship:

Entering only a single day is possible. The cost is 75% of the full entry cost. Payment for a single day is not available online. Stage Notes are mandatory; and, competitors may not refuse to pay the stage note fee.

"Two Buddy" Discount: Running on pavement is super fun and the people that have done it know this fact! To encourage new people to compete on tarmac, we offer the "Two Buddy" discount. Any entrant qualifies for the discount if he/she "brings" two entrants that have never competed at Rally Tennessee to the rally. The qualifying entrant will receive a 50% discount off the early entry for their appropriate vehicle (car/motorcycle).

Restrictions:

- This discount is only 50% of an early entry amount, regardless of when the qualifying entrant pays his/her entry fee.
- The discount applies only to the "finder".
- Car entrants cannot find two bike entrants. Recruited entries must be of like kind.
- This is a refund given at registration, all entrants pay the normal amount up front.
- The person/team claiming the discount must contact the organizer, before the new teams register, to document their connection.

3.7 Entry Paperwork

To make registration more orderly and to encourage timely completion of entry forms, any team without complete paperwork submitted prior to the rally registration will be assessed a \$20 Late Paperwork Fee.

For an entry to be considered complete, the following must be submitted:

- the entire entry fee; - online form
- all driver information - online form;
- all co-driver information - online form;
- all rally vehicle information - online form;
- all service vehicle information (as needed) - online form; and,
- all service crew information (as needed) - online form.

Please note that for the entry form to be complete, you must have your NASA membership and NASA Rally Sport competition license numbers and these must both be valid. The membership and license will be available for purchase at the event; however, applying for them at the event will still result in a Late Paperwork Fee. Please help our registration go smoothly and take care of **your** paperwork before you arrive. Our preference would be to have all the paperwork done a week before the rally and charge no one the Late Paperwork Fee.

Competitors will be required to sign a registration and insurance waiver, a standard liability waiver, a property damage waiver, a media authorization, a HIPPA waiver and a stage note disclaimer at the on-site rally registration.

You are required to present your state issued driving license to be verified at the on-site registration. Please bring this document with you to registration.

3.8 Payment

Only cash and checks will be accepted at registration. **Credit cards will not be accepted at registration.** Those wishing to pay via credit card may do so at www.rallytennessee.com. The online credit card service charges a 3% processing fee and the competitor will cover the extra charge for this service.

3.9 Refunds

- There are no refunds after the competitor has started shakedown or left the first time control.
- Entry fees shall be refunded in full if the event is canceled.
- Entry fees shall be refunded in full if the organizer refuses the entry.
- Entry fees shall be refunded minus \$75 if the competitor if the competitor withdraws their entry prior to registration and scrutineering. Within 72 hours or less of registration opening, entry fees shall be refunded minus \$150 if the competitor withdraws their entry. The last opportunity to withdraw your entry is prior to registration and scrutineering.
- Entry fees shall be refunded minus \$200 if the competitor does not leave the first time control, unless they have participated in shakedown.
- Entry fees will not be refunded for any competitor/team who is required to attend the Novice Competitor Orientation, fails to attend, and then wants to start the rally.
- In all cases, processing fees will not be refunded.
- In all cases, entry fees will be refunded by check.

3.10 Accepted Memberships

All competitors, without exception, must hold a NASA membership.

3.11 Accepted Licenses

All competitors, without exception, must present either:

1. a NASA Rally Sport Competition License
2. a CARS regional or CARS national rally license

Competitors purchasing a NASA Rally Sport license for the first time, or who have attended fewer than three Novice Competitor Orientations (NCOs), will need to attend the NCO, which is detailed in Section 21.

3.12 Note for Foreigners Applying for a NASA Rally Sport Competition License

Any valid driving license, including either a driving license from a foreign country, or an international driving license, can be used on the competition license application form.

International applicants will be accepted for NASA membership. There is no requirement to be a U.S. citizen or resident, or hold a U.S. driving license, to get either a membership or license.

4 Insurance

4.1 Description of Liability Insurance Coverage

The Entry Fee includes the insurance premium to insure the competitor and other parties as necessary against all third party bodily injury and property damage for the amount of \$5,000,000 per occurrence.

4.2 Description of Accident Medical Coverage

All competitors, service crews and all event participants (staff, marshals, volunteers, etc.) have secondary medical coverage of \$1,000,000. There is a \$1,000 deductible for those without their own primary medical coverage.

4.3 Period of Insurance Coverage

In general all insurance coverage will come into effect at the opening of the Rally Office. For each participant it begins when they sign the insurance waiver. Insurance coverage will end at the close of the Rally Office or at the moment of competitor retirement, exclusion or disqualification.

5 Advertising

5.1 Restrictions

Any advertising must comply with United States federal law and Tennessee state law.

5.2 Organizer Supplied Advertising

If an advertising sticker package is supplied by the organizers of Rally Tennessee it must be applied or the entrant must pay a \$100 Advertiser's Compensation fee.

6 Identification numbers

The size and location of the space for vehicle numbers is governed by the championship regulations. A set of numbers will be provided for each vehicle by NASA Rally Sport per Section 6.4 of the Atlantic Rally Cup Regulations and Sections 6.3 and 6.4 of the Atlantic RallyMoto™ Cup Regulations.

The numbers will be black. White backgrounds will be provided with the initial vinyl set from NASA Rally Sport for cars. Yellow backgrounds for motorcycles. A set of replacement numbers can be purchased. (Cars \$50, Bikes \$20).

If your team has not yet received the free NASA Rally Sport vinyl package, you may pick it up at registration. Service vehicle identification stickers shall be placed on the outside of the service vehicle windshield on the passenger side lower corner.

Stickers, vinyl, paint, or graphics containing text or logos of alternate sanctioning bodies must be removed or covered.

7 Tires

This event places no additional restrictions on tires beyond the NASA Rally Sport GRRs.

8 Fuel

Please adhere to state and federal guidelines for the transport of fuel to, from, and within Tennessee.

9 Testing

No testing is allowed, with definitions and penalties as per the GRRs.

10 Reconnaissance

10.1 Registration Schedule

All entrants taking part in the reconnaissance must register to obtain all necessary documents. Reconnaissance registration will only be done during the times listed below:

- Thursday, April 28, 2011 5 - 8pm at the Lobelville Public Works building (Express Registrants Only)
- Friday, April 29, 2011 8am - 3pm at the Lobelville Public Works building

10.2 Reconnaissance Vehicle Insurance

It is important to note that the vehicle used for reconnaissance must be covered by insurance in accordance with GRR § 2.3.2.

10.3 Reconnaissance Vehicle Identification

Competitors will be issued identification numbers to be affixed to the outside of the driver's side rear window. Failure to display these numbers or displaying them incorrectly or incompletely will result in a 30 second penalty.

10.4 Reconnaissance Schedule

The entire course opens simultaneously, but in one direction only. All stages run in the forward direction during the morning; and, all stages run in the reverse direction during the afternoon. Teams who begin reconnaissance on time will be able to make two passes over each stage.

- Forward direction 7 - 11am
- Reverse direction 12 - 4pm

10.5 Reconnaissance Speed Limit

On the special stages, the speed limit is 35 mph unless traffic signs indicate a lower limit. Competitors are reminded that stages will be open to normal traffic during reconnaissance and that they must drive in a manner that does not endanger or inconvenience other traffic. Speeds can be checked by either law enforcement or event officials using any method.

10.6 Penalties

No reconnaissance outside the official scheduled time is allowed for this rally. Illegal reconnaissance will result in exclusion from the rally. Failure to correctly display the reconnaissance vehicle identification will result in a 30 second penalty. Reckless driving or other unsportsmanlike conduct will be assessed a penalty per the discretion of the Clerk of the Course. Failure to follow direction of traffic for reconnaissance per the published schedule will result in disqualification from the event.

Penalties for speeding are as follows:

- 1st Offense = \$200
- 2nd Offense = \$400 and 2 minute penalty
- 3rd Offense = Disqualification

All fines must be paid in cash to the Clerk of the Course, prior to the first vehicle starting the Event.

10.7 Maximum Number of Passes.

Only two passes will be allowed per stage. This will be regulated by means of a reconnaissance log. All competitors must check in with the reconnaissance volunteer at the start of each stage.

10.8 Reconnaissance Vehicle

No competition vehicles may be used for reconnaissance. No vehicle may have decals or numbers or racing graphics other than recce identification numbers provided at recce registration.

10.9 Direction of Reconnaissance Traffic

Reconnaissance may only be conducted in one direction depending on the reconnaissance schedule. Failure to follow direction of traffic for reconnaissance per the published schedule will result in disqualification from the event.

11 Administrative Checks and Registration

11.3 Documents to be presented

The following items will be checked at registration:

1. Online entry (driver info, co-driver info, vehicle info) with all required information completed.
2. Driver, rider and co-driver NASA membership cards (must be current).
3. Driver, rider and co-driver rally competition license cards (must be current).
4. Driver, rider and co-driver state-issued driving license card (must be current).

If items 1 through 3 are not completed (renewed or submitted) by the Paperwork Completion Deadline an administrative Late Paperwork fee of \$20 will be applied. Please note that this fee will apply to any competitors who apply for licenses at the event.

RallyMoto™ competitors will not need to present any paperwork on co-drivers.

11.4 Registration Procedure

Express Registration entrants will be called to the front of the line during registration. **If the Registrar has not determined that you are eligible for Express Registration, other teams will be checking in before you, regardless of how long you have been waiting.** We encourage all entrants to submit their paperwork early.

11.5 Competitor Packet Contents

Competitors will receive a competitor packet at registration upon completion of all administrative checks and signature of required waivers. Competitor packets will include:

- Supplemental Regulations
- Rally Guide
- Route Book (cars)
- Roll Chart (bikes)
- Route Book Preamble (bikes)
- Service vehicle sticker

There is no "Service Packet". All necessary information for servicing is in the Rally Guide.

12 Scrutineering, Sealing, and Marking

Scrutineering will check the safety and eligibility of the vehicles to compete. Vehicles may also be checked for general road worthiness, homologation papers, verification of VIN, or other aspects of vehicle legality.

12.3 Log Books

Log books will be retained by the Chief Scrutineer. They may be picked up at the Awards Party. The Chief Scrutineer will be made aware of any DNFs and those vehicles will be inspected before the log books is returned. Following the event, any remaining log books may be mailed to you at your expense by contacting the Chief Scrutineer.

13 Shakedown

13.1 Participation

Competitors who have completed registration, scrutineering, and the Novice Competitor Orientation (if required) may run the shakedown stage. All safety gear is required.

13.2 Location

Short Creek Road, Linden, Tennessee. Directions will be provided in the Road Book and the Rally Guide, Section 25.2, reference Short Creek.

13.3 Times

Friday, April 29, 2011 4:30 - 6:30pm

13.4 Participants

No service crew members or spectators may participate by riding in a vehicle at the shakedown stage. Please note that the shakedown stage is used for publicity. Rides in rally vehicles are sometimes arranged for event sponsors and town officials. Some teams will be approached and asked to provide rides for these individuals. Please understand that this sort of activity is paramount for continued close relations with the towns and counties that allows use of their roads. These riders may need to borrow safety equipment. The ride with a sponsor should be at 60 - 70% of testing speeds and viewed as a ride, not an opportunity to test.

13.5 Cost

Each run through the shakedown stage costs five dollars. When carrying a sponsor or official the run will be free of charge.

13.6 Spectators at the Shakedown

One spectator area will be available at the Shakedown stage. All persons who go to this spectator area must sign a waiver. Spectators will be allowed within the taped off area only. Any team members or crew traveling outside the taped area will incur a one minute penalty.

13.7 Parc Exposé for Shakedown Participants

Competitors who participate in the Shakedown stage must attend the Parc Exposé immediately following the Shakedown stage. The Parc Exposé will take place on Highway 13 in Linden, Tennessee from 6:30 - 7:30pm.

14 Start of the Rally

14.1 Publication Times of Starting Order

The official starting order for Leg One will be posted Saturday, April 20, 2011 8am at the Lobelville Public Works building. The start order for Leg Two will be posted on Sunday, May 1, 2011 8am at the Perry County High School.

The list of entrants will be updated periodically on the event web site. At no time will the list of entrants posted on the web site be considered an official start order. The actual start order will be determined by the Stewards of the Event and the Clerk of the Course. These officials will use speed factors, an individual's competitive history, and the vehicles entered as input when deciding start position.

14.2 Official Time

14.3 Ceremonial Start

There will be no ceremonial start.

14.4 Official Start Location

On Saturday, April 30, 2011, the start will be at the intersection of Highway 13 and East 6th Street in Lobelville, Tennessee. On Sunday, May 1, 2011, the start will be at the Perry County High School in Linden, Tennessee.

14.5 Official Start Time

On Saturday, April 30, 2011, the first vehicle will be scheduled to start Leg One of the rally at 8:31am. On Sunday, May 1, 2011, the first vehicle will be scheduled to start Leg Two of the rally at 8:31am.

14.6 Start Area / Start Parc Exposé

All competing vehicles and crews must report to the start area and Parc Exposé by 7:30am on both Saturday, April 30, 2011, and Sunday, May 1, 2011.

15 Running of the Rally

Early check-in in accordance with GRR 2.17.3 is authorized for the final controls of Leg One and Leg Two.

15.2 Starting System of Special Stages

The starter will count down vehicles verbally. Motorcycles will be released on thirty-second intervals if more than 29 motorcycles are entered in the rally. Cars will be released on one minute intervals.

15.3 Identification of Officials

Officials of the event will be identified as detailed below.

15.4 Time Control and Check-In Procedure

Controls will be run according to GRR 2.18, using the Modified FIA System. The rally will be scored in hours, minutes and seconds.

15.5 Maximum Permitted Lateness

The MPL for competition vehicles is 15 minutes.

15.6 Notification of Traffic Violations

Any competitor who receives a traffic violation, or discovers that their crew has received a traffic violation, must notify the Clerk of the Course as soon as possible. Penalties will be awarded as per GRR 2.24. Any competitor failing to take documented action to notify the Clerk of the Course at the next service or time control immediately following the receipt of the traffic violation will be assessed a double time penalty.

15.7 Retirement

Any crew retiring permanently from the rally must report such retirement to the organizers as soon as possible using the Withdrawal Form located in the Road Book. Any crew failing to comply will be liable to a sanction at the Stewards' discretion. The crew should complete the form and turn it into a rally official.

15.8 Re-Starting

There are limited opportunities for returning a vehicle to the field. The only point at which any reentry will be considered is following a service or the start of Leg Two. The vehicle must be re-inspected by the Chief Scrutineer and approved by the Stewards and the Clerk of the Course. The vehicle will be scored as DNF. The vehicle will no longer be a competitor and no times from any further stages it completes will be posted.

Competitors will be re-inserted as close to their previous position as possible. Any competitors who have restarted must not pass any other competitor (excluding disabled or stopped vehicles) upon pain of a \$100 fine payable to Clerk of the Course and, which must be paid before the Chief Scrutineer will return their logbook. Sweep will not wait for re-started teams to reach a maximum permitted lateness time. Restarted teams that are stopped on the course and are caught by the sweep vehicle will be excluded from further participation regardless of maximum permitted lateness.

15.9 Stage Note Disclaimer

The stage note system uses an automated computer program to generate a description of the special stage road using sensors fitted to a vehicle driven through each stage. The Stage Notes are intended for use without reconnaissance. They describe the route in more detail than the Road Book. The use of the Stage Notes is a direct contract between the competitor and P-Sport, Inc., with the organizer's involvement being limited to authorizing the use and facilitating the preparation and distribution on behalf of P-Sport, Inc.

15.10 Chicanes

Chicanes have been established on each stage for the benefit of slowing vehicle's average and top speeds. These chicanes are made of barrels containing water and weighing approximately 1200 pounds each. The location and entry point for the chicanes are outlined in the Road Book and Stage Notes. Chicanes use two or three elements. Penalties will be assessed for bypassing a chicane (shorting the course) or striking a chicane per GRR 2.23.1. Destroying a barrel (damage to the point where it will leak water) will also carry a \$50 damage fee.

16 Service Areas

Saturday's service area will be in downtown Lobelville, from East 6th Avenue to East 4th Avenue. Service will only be allowed on the eastern side of the street. The gravel parking lot at the corner of Main Street and East 4th Avenue may also be used for service. Trailer parking is not allowed in the service area. Trailer parking is available in front of the baseball field at West 6th Avenue and Rose Street. Service crews may enter and begin set-up in the service area at 7am on Saturday, April 20, 2011.

Sunday's service area will be located at the Perry County High School in Linden, Tennessee. Teams who wish to continuously run generators or diesel engines must set up their service area as far away from the High School as possible. Teams who do not take this into consideration may be asked to relocate their service site. All trash must be disposed in the dumpsters located on the left side of the High School building. Each team must dispose of its own trash. Trailer parking is not allowed in the service area. Trailer parking is available in front of the baseball field at West 6h Avenue and Rose Street in Lobelville, Tennessee. Service crews may enter and begin set-up in the service area at 7am on Sunday, May 1, 2011.

16.2 Access Times for Service Vehicles

Rally vehicles may not enter or park in the service areas on Thursday, April 28 and Friday, April 29, 2011.

Violators will be asked to move. Service crews may enter and begin set-up in the service area at 7am on Saturday, April 20, 2011 and Sunday, May 1, 2011. Vehicles not registered for service may not enter the service area.

Trailer parking is not allowed in the service area. Trailer parking is available in front of the baseball field at West 6th Avenue and Rose Street.

16.3 Trash disposal

All trash must be disposed of in the on-site waste receptacles/dumpsters. On Sunday, waste dumpsters can be found to the left of the High School, behind the short brick wall.

17 Prizes

Trophies will be awarded within each class. Overall positions will be recognized by applause. The number of trophies to be awarded will be determined by the number of entrants in each class as of the end of the Early Entry period.

Trophies must be claimed at the awards ceremony or competitors can arrange in advance to pick up their trophy the next morning. Trophies not collected may be shipped at the competitor's expense. The competitor may either pay \$30 or provide a FedEx or UPS shipping account number for this service. Requests for trophy shipping must be made by the Friday following the event. Trophies will not be given to anyone other than team members. No third party couriers will be used.

No cash or other monetary prizes will be awarded by the organizers.

18 Final Checks

After clearing the final control the Chief Scrutineer will notify any competitors who need to move their vehicle into Parc Fermé for scrutineering.

19 Results

19.1 Publication of Provisional Final Results

Provisional final results will be posted at the Awards Party at 8pm on Sunday, May 1, 2011.

20 Protests

It should be understood that the generally accepted procedure for issues is first to submit an inquiry using the Inquiry Form from the Road Book. No fee is associated with an inquiry. The event officials will rule on the inquiry. Should the competitors not be satisfied with the ruling, they may duly lodge a protest. A fee is associated with a protest. The event officials will rule on the protest. Should the competitors still not be

satisfied, they must file an Intent to Appeal with the Stewards within one hour of the protest decision and must also send their appeal to the Secretary of the National Court of Appeal (GRR 2.30).

20.1 Protest Fees

Protest fees will be in accordance with GRR 2.30.

21 Novice Competitor Orientation

This year two Novice Competitor Orientations (NCOs) will be offered at the event. The first NCO will be held on Thursday, April 28, 2011, 6 - 9pm TBD in Lobelville. The second NCO will be held on Friday, April 29, 2011, 6 - 9pm at the Conference Room of The Commodore Hotel.

The Novice Competitor Orientation costs five dollars per attendee, payable to the instructor, to cover costs of materials. Competitors who are not required to attend but wish to sit in on the seminar are welcome to do so at no charge.

21.3 Participation

Participation will be in accordance with GRR 2.5.9: “New rally competitors are required to participate in a Novice Competitor Orientation (NCO)” and “It is the competitor’s obligation to see that this requirement is satisfied.”

Competitors purchasing a NASA Rally Sport rally license for the first time, or those who have attended fewer than three orientations, must attend the licensing school unless granted an exemption as described in section 21.4 below. Competitors may attend both during the weekend if they want to complete their orientation requirements more quickly. Competitors who are required to attend and who fail to do so will not be allowed to participate in recce, the shakedown stage or start the rally.

21.4 Exemption

Competitors wishing an exemption from the NCO may request an exemption by doing *both* of the following:

- Documenting their relevant rally experience and submitting a [NCO Exemption Request form](#) before the Paperwork Completion Deadline,
- Submitting a complete entry by the Paperwork Completion Deadline.

The request will be either approved or denied by NASA Rally Sport. **Competitors may not request a NCO exemption after the Paperwork Completion Deadline.** One possible reason for having an exemption approved would be having a rally license issued by another organization, such as the FIA.

22 Appendices

22.1 Appendix 1 – DNF / Accident Procedures

If a competitor is unable to continue, they must do the following:

- Submit a Notice of Withdrawal form (from the Road Book) to the Clerk of the Course,
- Turn in the time card to a control volunteer or other event official.

If any accident with injury or third party damage occurs, the competitor must complete an Incident Report located in the Road Book. Note that in many cases, both forms will be required. Regardless of circumstances, the Chief Scrutineer will check your vehicle before your log book is returned to you.

No exemptions have been issued.

22.5 Appendix 6 – Additional RallyMoto™ Regulations

The rules in this appendix are in addition to the existing RallyMoto™ rules in the GRRs.

1. The organizer may deny entry to any bike deemed unsuitable for competition.
2. Neck braces are recommended.
3. Tank-top area score card holders are recommended. This style of score card holder was found to be beneficial due to its accessibility by the control worker, who could get the card, mark, and return it, while the competitor kept their gloves and safety equipment on. The score cards will be a 5.5” x 8.5” size.
4. For paved events, full leathers with armor are highly recommended. The preferred materials if leather is not used are Cordura or Kevlar with a Denier measurement of 1000 or better. In all cases where the pants and jacket are two separate pieces the two pieces must attach to each other securely. Standard nylon mesh pants are not permitted. The following items are permitted:
 - Kevlar race suits
 - heavy duty (enduro) jacket
 - motocross pants with armor
